Activity 6: Improving communication with key stake holders such as parents, alumni, industries and local Leaders.

Improvement Plan:

- 1. Job oriented training will be provided to motivate students.

- 3. Linkage will be established with the recruiting agencies for campus selection

Activity 7: Improving faculty competency items of ascendancy proficiency communicative skills and administrative capacity.
